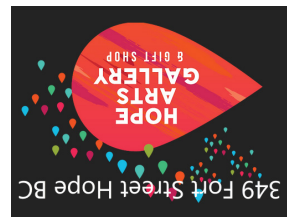

Syéxw Chó:leqw Adventure Park

The Syéxw Chó:leqw Adventure Park opened in September 2018 to serve the local trails and recreation community. The Park is on the traditional land and territory of Sq'ewá:lxw First Nation. It includes 4,000 metres of walking and cycling trails, a bike skills park, viewing platforms, a 90,000-square-foot playground, and other supporting facilities. Visitors can also enjoy the many art installations throughout the park, including mural paintings and wood sculptures.

Tuckkwiowhum Village (pronounced Tuck-we-ohm) is a First Nations heritage site and village located in Nlaka'pamux territory, 5 km south of Boston Bar, BC. Tuckkwiowhum Village boasts breathtaking views and surroundings, a full-service longhouse/events pavilion, an on-site restaurant, entertainment, cultural classes/workshops, and a traditional teepee campground.

Othello Tunnels

Discover the impressive Othello Tunnels, a series of train tunnels and bridges that are part of the historic Kettle Valley Railway. Built with significant contributions from Chinese labourers in the late 19th and 20th centuries, this 5 tunnel path is carved through steep walls. This 3.5 km round-trip trail is an easy and level stroll suitable for families of all ages. Simply park and follow the signs along the river trail and immerse yourself in both nature and history.

This site sustained significant damage from flooding in 2021. Some areas of the site may not be accessible.

Alexandra Suspension Bridge

Alexandra Bridge is a beautiful steel and concrete suspension bridge spanning the Fraser River. Located 22 kilometers north of Yale, the historic place includes the 1926 bridge, along with associated roadworks and retaining walls and remnants of the original 1863 bridge. Nearby are historic fur brigade trails and early roads now used as walking trails. The bridge is a must-see, offering not only historical and cultural significance but also stunning views within the picturesque Fraser Canyon landscape.

E.C. Manning Park (aka Manning Park)

E.C. Manning Park is in the heart of the Cascade Mountains, located along Highway 3. It occupies a large amount of land between Hope and Princeton along the Canada-U.S. border. The park covers 83,671 hectares and has an extraordinarily diverse landscape, easy access, and countless recreational opportunities. It offers four drive-in campgrounds for summer camping and many opportunities for backcountry camping. It also features a wide variety of trails, which range from 15-minute walks to six-day backcountry hikes.

Sunshine Valley Tashme Museum

Tashme Museum in Sunshine Valley, formerly Tashme was Canada's largest Japanese Canadian internment site during the Second World War. Located 19 Kilometers East of Hope in Sunshine Valley, the museum is nestled in a valley surrounded by mountains, offering a beautiful landscape for nature walks and insights into the history of Japanese Canadian internment. The Tashme Museum showcases the history, personal stories, and artifacts of Tashme, a Japanese Canadian internment camp from 1942 to 1946.
